FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES FOR WOMEN

AAUW is among the world's leading sources of funding for women's education. We provide

- more than \$4 million in AAUW fellowships and grants (from \$2,000 to \$30,000) for domestic and international women students pursuing graduate and postdoctoral study at accredited U.S. institutions;
- access to a database of AAUW branch and state undergraduate scholarships from \$500 to \$2,500 each for women students;
- AAUW Community Action Grants from \$2,000 to \$10,000 for innovative programs and research that promote AAUW branch/state and community collaboration on issues related to women and girls in education; and
- scholarships for your students to attend AAUW's National Conference for College Women Student Leaders in Washington, D.C. (a partnership with NASPA).

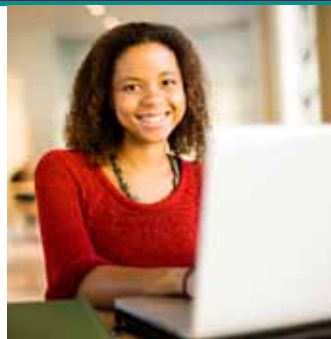
STUDENT OPPORTUNITIES

AAUW has partnership programming opportunities available for your students. Here are a few programs we can work on together:

- Campus Action Project grants—AAUW awards grants of up to \$5,000 to campus teams composed of students and faculty or administrators. Teams implement gender equity projects that highlight current AAUW research findings on campus.

- \$tart \$mart Salary Negotiation Workshops. AAUW and the WAGE Project offer training that teaches students to negotiate salaries and benefits as they approach the job market.
- Campus sexual assault program. AAUW has partnered with Students Active for Ending Rape (SAFER) to provide information about the prevalence of campus sexual assault and ideas for action that students, faculty and staff, and alumni can take to prevent and respond to it.
- Legal Advocacy Fund Campus Outreach Program grants. Partner with an AAUW branch to apply for grants up to \$1,000 to implement a gender equity program or event on your campus.
- Elect Her – Campus Women Win. This collaboration between AAUW and Running Start encourages and trains women to run for student government on their campuses.
- National Conference for College Women Student Leaders. Each year more than 500 college student leaders hone their skills in leadership, advocacy, civic engagement, networking, and career planning in Washington, D.C.
- AAUW Student Advisory Council. Your students have opportunities to present at conferences, serve on the AAUW national student advisory council, and lead an AAUW student affiliate group on your campus.

A VOICE IN WASHINGTON

AAUW supports a strong education system that promotes gender fairness, equality, and diversity. AAUW also fosters factual and objective dialogue with legislators and leaders that results in political, regulatory, and legal support for women's equity in all areas of education and the workplace.

- Gain a respected and powerful partner and advocate on state and federal issues and receive alerts on legislation and regulations that affect higher education, such as Title IX, pay equity, grant opportunities, and appropriations.

VISIBILITY

CHANGE-MAKING RESEARCH

AAUW's research focuses on issues that affect women and girls in education and the workplace, informs our advocacy, and mobilizes individuals and communities into action.

Why So Few? Women in Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics, AAUW's latest research report, received enormous publicity for its in-depth and accessible profiles of eight key research findings that point to environmental and social barriers—including stereotypes, gender bias, and the climate of science and engineering departments in colleges and universities—that continue to block women's participation and progress in science, technology, engineering, and math. This National Science Foundation-funded study highlights evidence-based, practical steps that can be undertaken to increase women's presence and success in these fields.

Behind the Pay Gap, AAUW's groundbreaking research on pay equity, found that one year out of college, women working full time earn only 80 percent as much as their male colleagues earn. Ten years after graduation, women fall further behind, earning only 69 percent as much as men earn. This report generated a national debate on the wage disparity and played a key role in passage of important national legislation to address pay discrimination.

When you become a partner member your students and faculty have access to the resources behind these reports, such as state-by-state data on the pay gap between male and female full-time workers and the free fair-pay compensation tool that AAUW developed with Job Search Intelligence to analyze personal salary targets and compare job markets.
