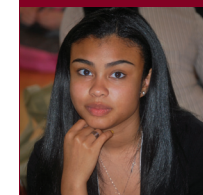

### What is AAUW?

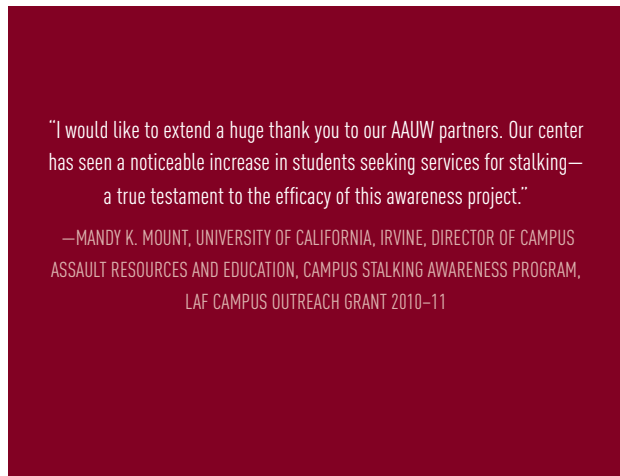
Since 1881, the American Association of University Women (AAUW) has been breaking through barriers so that all women have a fair chance. Today, AAUW is a nationwide community of more than 100,000 members and donors, 1,000 branches, and 500 college and university partners. AAUW uses our powerful voice to speak out on issues such as education, pay equity, civil rights, reproductive rights, affirmative action, and sex discrimination.

### Why is AAUW important to you?

- Recent female graduates working full time still earn less than their male colleagues—even when they have the same job in the same field. Ten years after graduation, the pay gap widens. AAUW training can help you bridge that gap.
- Violations of Title IX, the law that prohibits sex discrimination in education, are often ignored. You can join AAUW’s community-based work for better enforcement of the law.
- Sexual assault and sexual harassment are serious campus issues. Nearly two-thirds of college students experience sexual harassment at some point during college, according to AAUW’s research report *Drawing the Line*. In response, AAUW has partnered with Students Active for Ending Rape (SAFER) to provide information about the prevalence of campus sexual assault and ideas for action that college communities can take to end it.
- Women are significantly underrepresented in federal, state, and local governments. AAUW’s Elect Her initiative trains women to run for elected office—and win.
- AAUW has fellowships available in our Public Policy and Government Relations, Marketing and Communications, Fellowships and Grants, Development, Programs, Publications, and Membership departments.

## EDUCATE

- One of the world’s largest sources of funding for graduate women, AAUW provides more than \$4 million annually for fellowships and grants to outstanding women and non-profit organizations. Fellowship and grant recipients perform research in a wide range of disciplines and work to improve the lives of women and girls, their schools, and their communities.
- AAUW branches and states offer more than \$1 million in undergraduate scholarships for women students annually.
- AAUW Campus Action Projects provide grants of up to \$5,000 to students and faculty for campus-based gender equity projects.
- The AAUW Legal Advocacy Fund Campus Outreach Program makes grants available for student programs that address sex discrimination on campus.
- AAUW and NASPA proudly present the National Conference for College Women Student Leaders (NCCWSL), the only conference that brings together college women to address contemporary leadership issues. AAUW provides more than \$20,000 in scholarships for NCCWSL attendees each year.
- Elect Her—Campus Women Win, a collaboration between AAUW and Running Start, encourages young women to run for student government on their campuses.
